The Airports Board met on Thursday, August 18, 2016 at 1:30 p.m. in the Council Chambers in the Town of Hilton Head. Chairman Wallace called the meeting to order and led the attendees in the Pledge of Allegiance.

County Staff: Jon Rembold, Airports Director; Renee' Ford, Administrative Assistant; Alicia Holland (CFO) and Linda Maietta, Finance.

Public: Judy Elder - Talbert, Bright and Ellington; Mike French and Mike Peery – Signature Flight Support; and James Fisher - resident.

MOTION TO ACCEPT AGENDA

Motion: It was moved by Mr. Dopp, seconded by Mr. Buckley that the August 18, 2016 agenda be approved. The vote was: FOR – Rich Sells, Jim Buckley, Greg Viventi, Wally Wallace, Will Dopp, Anne Esposito and Leslie Adlam. AGAINST – None. ABSENT: Blakely Williams, Dan Ahern, and Gerry Costa. MOTION TO ACCEPT MINUTES

Motion: It was moved by Mr. Sells, seconded by Mr. Viventi that the July 21, 2016 minutes be approved. <u>PUBLIC COMMENTS</u> – Mr. James Fisher, Port Royal Plantation resident, expressed his concerns regarding the variance as it relates to the reduction of the buffer on Summit Drive and the requirement for mitigation planting.

AIRPORTS FINANCIALS

Alicia Holland, Beaufort County Chief Financial Officer, briefed the board on FY2016 preliminary year ending results for Lady's Island Airport and Hilton Head Island Airport financial report. **Mr. Sells** asked if the \$500,000 is reimbursed by the FAA? Ms. Holland stated

no, it is not reimbursed by the FAA. This was an unappropriated payment made between Beaufort County, Town of Hilton Head and Palmetto Hall. A Memorandum of Understanding was signed in December 2015. Mr. Rembold indicated the funds are in an escrow with the Town of Hilton Head and the funds are drawn from that account.

Mr. Dopp asked if the board will see the a financial summary quarterly. Ms. Holland stated she will publish a quarterly summary on the county website and provide copies for the board.

LADY'S ISLAND AIRPORT REPORT

Mr. Rembold reported on the fuel sales and operations for the Lady's Island Airport for July 2016.

HILTON HEAD ISLAND AIRPORT REPORT

Mr. Rembold gave the fuel sales, tower and operations reports for July 2016.

Mr. Rembold reported, SCAC is conducting a study about the economic impact of the airports in South Carolina. They will assess each airport within the state commercial and general aviation airports. There will be an individual report for each airport and its economic impact; as well as a collective summary of the economic impact of the airports throughout the state. Once the report is completed, Mr. Rembold will make it available to the board and to the public.

Mr. Sells asked if ARW and HXD Ops/stats reports could be shown during the meeting for the public. Mr. Rembold stated we will present documents during the meeting for the public.

Mr. Rembold distributed an article regarding the State revenue shortfall. In summary, the cuts hit the Aeronautics Commission the hardest. State funds are 5% of our grants for airport development which potentially will be impacted. Mr. Rembold asked the board to respond to the controller the economy impact our Airports have in South Carolina. An example, is the direct and indirect economic impact from Hilton Head airport has during the Heritage; it's approximately \$81.8 million dollars annually.

Mr. Dopp asked if the County will be making a statement in response to the article. Mr. Rembold stated he was not aware of the County making a statement at this time.

PROJECT SCHEDULE UPDATE

LADY'S ISLAND PROJECT UPDATE

Mr. Rembold discussed Lady's Island **RWY 7 Obstruction Removal**. Will be executing tree removal project soon; waiting on final easements.

Mr. Rembold discussed Lady's Island **RWY 7 Safety Area and Parallel Environmental Assessment**. The Environmental Assessment is completed; available for public review at the Beaufort Branch library and airport. Public hearing will take place August 18th at 4:30PM in the Lady's Island conference room. Board members are welcomed to attend.

HILTON HEAD PROJECT UPDATE

RUNWAY 03/21 TREE OBSTRUCTION REMOVAL - Mr. Rembold stated Tree Obstruction Removal project is almost completed. Coordinating with the project arborist to get the mitigation plans underway.

St. James Baptist Church is the last property for the tree approach project; ongoing discussions continues with the church, the Town and County officials.

TAXIWAY A AND GA RAMP REPLACEMENT - Mr. Rembold reported the project is approximately 55% complete; ramp replacement and RTR relocation is complete.

RUNWAY 03/21 EXTENSION – RWY 21 Drainage opening bid is August 18th, 2016; working with the FAA on funding schedule to determine the final timeline for the construction project.

DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Airport Advertising – Departure Media has begun their transition; they will handle both airports. They were able to obtain previous companies and acquire new businesses; getting involved with local businesses and the Chamber of Commerce. **Mr. Buckley** asked if their responsibilities include marketing the airport outside the community. Mr. Rembold responded by stating Departure Media is only responsible for the inside of the terminal. **Mr. Buckley** asked if we've had a noticeable impact with the ads the airport has placed in other magazines? Mr. Rembold stated it's hard to tell we don't have a direct way to find out.

Mr. Rembold stated **Hilton Head Part 139** inspection will be at August 24-26.

Mr. Rembold stated **project updates** are available on Hilton Head Island Airport website; www.hiltonheadairport.com.

IN: Single-Engine Plane Crashes Into House

Aug. 26--Emergency responders had to extricate two men from a single-engine plane after it crashed into a home in northern Vigo County shortly after 7 p.m. Thursday.

"We had two patients who were extricated from the aircraft," Josh Craft of the Otter Creek Fire Department told reporters.

"The extent of the injuries are unknown at this time. We do not know why the aircraft crashed. There will be an ongoing investigation."

Both men were airlifted from the site by LifeLine helicopter.

Vigo County Sheriff Greg Ewing also was at the crash site in the 3100 block of East Rosehill Avenue in North Terre Haute.

"We received a call of a plane into a house," Ewing said. "It looks like it was coming from the east [toward Sky King Airport]. It clipped those tree limbs right over there. My assumption would be it was headed for a landing."

The Federal Aviation Administration registry shows the plane's tail numbers registered to a single-engine Cessna Model 172N.

Ewing and Craft said the FAA had been notified, and its investigators are expected to arrive Friday morning.

"Now this becomes their scene," said Ewing.

No people were inside the home when the airplane struck, resident Matt Fox said.

Fox was concerned about his fox terrier, Lilly, who eventually came out barking and apparently unharmed, drawing applause from the crowd that had gathered at the site.

Getting the men out of the wreckage was not easy for authorities.

"It obviously was a difficult extrication, not something we normally would train for," Craft said. "But we worked quickly and worked as a team and got both patients out of the aircraft and loaded into helicopters."

"One of the main concerns initially when the fire department arrived was the fuselage and the fuel that is held in the wings leaking into the house," Ewing added. "That's why you saw the fire department using foam to kind of blanket the area to prevent any type of fire because aircraft fuel is very flammable."

Despite the risk, there were no reports of flames at the scene.

Craft said he wasn't sure how long emergency personnel would be at the house.

"It could be quite a while," he said. "I'm not sure. We've never had an aircraft incident like this, at least not in recent history. So it could be an extended stay."

The home struck by the plane is behind Fox's Meat Market & Grocery, across Clinton Street from Sky King Airport.

Quincey and Penni Smith said they'd lived in the neighborhood for about 10 years, and this was the first time they'd seen a plane hit a house despite close proximity of homes to Sky King Airport.

Penni called 9-1-1 after the crash, the Smiths said.

"I heard the initial crash from the trees, where it hit," Quincey Smith said. "It sounded almost like a dump truck, like when they pick up dumpsters and slam 'em down. It sounded like that, but it had a different sound to it."

After he realized it was a plane crash, he ran back inside the house and told his wife to call authorities.

"I didn't see it happen, but I heard it," Penni said.

Agencies responding to the call, which came in at 7:07 p.m., were the Vigo County Sheriff's Department, Otter Creek Fire Department, Indiana State Police, State Excise Police, Trans-Care Ambulance and LifeLine.

Ewing said this crash was a first for him, too.

"I don't know if in my career of 26 years [in law enforcement] -- we've had plane crashes -- but I don't know that I've ever worked a plane crashing into a house," Ewing said.
