## **About COSA**

- A process initially targeting adults referred for additional assistance by Beaufort Memorial Hospital emergency department or inpatient services, as well as adults at the County's Detention Center who may be in need of additional supportive services.
- The process allows for a multidisciplinary approach and coordinated therapeutic care for staffing the County's most complex cases of individuals struggling with dual diagnoses or other social issues, to include mental health issues, trauma, or substance abuse.
- Human Services Department seeking to expand its contracted services to support this new initiative.

## **First COSA Review**

23 year old young man who has been denied disability benefits, is actively psychotic and receives medical care through Access Health Lowcountry.

#### Since turning 18:

•	13 detention center stays	\$ 26,100
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- 114 emergency room visits......\$456,000
- 14 mental health hospital stays......\$420,000

TOTAL COST over 5 years......\$902,100

Approximate Average = \$180,420 per year

# **Solutions Coordinated by COSA**

- COSA Team will begin Preventive Monitoring
- Referral to Social Security Administration with case coordination by SC Dept. of Mental Health
- Home Share program (\$16,000 per year)
- United Way assisting with legal aid referral
- Voc. Rehab. will provide job training/coaching (if/when appropriate)
